Purpose	To support the fire and emergency management sector to make decisions about sharing responsibility for community safety
Approach	Generate new knowledge and learning opportunities

## The problem



- 1. How do we realistically share responsibility to manage risk amongst different parties so that communities are as safe and resilient as possible?
  - a) E.g. amongst communities, households and individuals, fire and EM agencies, other sectors and levels of government, private industry, non-government organisations, and society more broadly
  - b) Focus on community bushfire safety in later stages

	Objectives
Stage 1 Concept review	Review ways that responsibility sharing issues are conceptualized in relevant research
Stage 2 Stakeholder engagement	Direct project towards industry learning needs (ongoing)
Stage 3 Policy review	Identify responsibility-sharing issues encountered in a range of sectors internationally, & the policy responses
Stage 4 Australian case studies	Investigate specific responsibility-sharing issues encountered in Australian fire and emergency management
Stage 5 Synthesis	Identify and evaluate alternatives to share responsibility for community bushfire safety in Australia in the context of what we learn through Stages 1-3

- 1. What issues were at stake?
- 2. When and why did these issues arise?
- 3. How was the underlying problem framed?
- 4. Who was involved?

- 6. What were the expected roles and obligations of different parties (according to different views)?
- 7. What has been the outcome?
- 8. What factors influenced the outcome?
- Are we asking the right questions?
- Where should we look?
- What types of issues should we look at?
