






Findings from past bushfire incidents suggest failure to consider worst case scenarios can result in tragedy

HFIP Stages

- 1. Set the parameters
- 2. Elicit the narrative and its chapters
- 3. Collaborative analysis of the chapters
- 4. Stepping back the wisdom of hindsight
- 5. 'Anything else?' check
- 6. Bigger picture
- 7. Even bigger picture
- 8. Wrap up



PROGRAM D: The use of worst case scenarios The HFIP produced rich and useful data for investigating worst case scenarios Participants consistently mentioned worst case scenarios when verbally recalling a past fire event Common themes provided insight into the impact of worst case scenarios on decision making Difference of reporting of worst case scenarios at different levels of command
