

# HOUSEHOLDERS' 'BLACK SATURDAY' BUSHFIRE SURVIVAL DECISIONS

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# THE 7 FEBRUARY 2009—'BLACK SATURDAY'—VICTORIAN BUSHFIRES:

Extreme fire weather warnings six days before.

On the day: 45° + temperatures; RHs < 10%; +100kph winds.



## Aftermath:

- 172 deaths
- 2000+ homes destroyed
- 5,000+ homeless



## The Bushfire CRC Research Task Force: Teams to the eight worst affected fire areas



#### **METHODOLOGY**

496 interviews were transcribed (39 householders were not at home on the day 'by chance').

- •Content-analysis of the transcripts using *nVivo* software: codings/ratings.
- •Quantitative analyses using SPSS software.


#### **RESULTS**

457 householders made bushfire survival decisions.


#### 1. Actions/Outcomes (n = 457):




# 2. Actions/Intentions (n = 457):

## **CONCLUSIONS**

#### Stayed and Defended

(Most engaged with bushfire risk)

- Prized home/property
- Planned and prepared
- Expected to succeed.

#### **Left Under Threat**

(Few engaged with bushfire risk)

- Lower levels of planning/preparation
- Reacted to emerging threat
  - -- Perceived danger
  - -- Concern for family.
